She is currently the Leneen Forde Chair of Child and Family Research, School of SHS - Human Services and Social Work, Griffith University.





Professor Silke Meyer

Professor Silke Meyer is the Leneen Forde Chair in Child and Family Research in the School of Health Sciences and Social Work at Griffith University. She is a member of the Griffith Criminology Institute and the Griffith Centre for Mental Health. She is the former Deputy Director of the Monash Gender and Family Violence Prevention Centre and continues to hold an adjunct appointment with the Centre. She is a criminologist and social worker by training, bringing practical and theoretical expertise to her research, teaching and writing. Her research centres on different aspects of domestic and family violence, including women and children's safety, wellbeing and recovery, men's accountability in their role as perpetrators and fathers, experiences specific to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities and the role of domestic and family violence-informed practice in child protection, policing and court proceedings. She is an expert in holistic and collaborative service responses to individuals and families affected by domestic and family violence, including evidence-based policy and practice reform.

Silke has delivered evaluations for a number of government and non-government organisations, including police, child protection, courts, perpetrator intervention and victim support services. She is a Subject Matter Expert for the Raising Children Network and a former non-government member of the inaugural Qld Domestic and Family Violence Death Review and Advisory Board. Her research has been published and cited across disciplines and continues to inform policy and practice in areas of victim, perpetrator and family-related service delivery.

Liam is a CEO, writer and public speaker who specialises in helping organisations navigate transformational change. With a focus on engaging people through change, Liam specialises in working with communities in complex environments to achieve sustainable, just and desired futures. He is a Senior Fellow with the Centre for Postnormal Policy and Futures Studies and an Adjunct Industry Fellow for The School of Social Sciences, University of the Sunshine Coast.



Professor Paul 't Hart

Paul is a Professor of Public Administration at Utrecht University and Associate Dean of the Netherlands School of Public Administration in The Hague. He resumed both positions in mid-2011, after spending five years as Professor of Political Science at the Australian National University. Paul's research, teaching and consulting covers political and public sector leadership, policy evaluation, public accountability and crisis management.



Professor Sohail Inayatullah

Sohail is the inaugural UNESCO Chair in Futures Studies. He is a political scientist/futurist at Tamkang University, Taipei; and an Associate at Melbourne Business School, the University of Melbourne. He was an Adjunct Professor at USC and from 2011-2014, an Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Policing, Counter-terrorism and Intelligence, Macquarie University, Sydney.
